## **Daniel Ham Family**

Compiled by Bruce A. Fowler Hartland Historical Society ~ 2013 (Updated October 1, 2023)

<u>Note</u>: John Ham is noted in several early publications of New Hampshire's history as "a family member of the Pioneer William Ham" (See Samuel Ham Family), but was likely a nephew or cousin as he was not mentioned in William Ham's Will as a direct heir or child. John is often noted on family trees on Ancestry.com and other research sites as a son of William & Honor Ham, but the alleged connection remains to be confirmed with supported documentation and is not included in this document. However, as fate would have it, descendants of these 2 family lines, Helen Marguerite Ham & Alton Maurice Littlefield, would eventually marry in Hartland in 1932 as noted below.

"June 28, 1689; about 8 o'clock, morning. Just now came ashore here from Cocheca. John Ham and his wife, who went hence last night homeward, they living within a mile of Major Waldron, and about break of day going up the river in a canoe, they heard guns fired but notwithstanding proceeded to land at Major Waldron's landing place, by which time it began to be light, and they saw about twenty Indians near Mr. Coffin's garrison, shouting and shouting, as many more around Richard Otis' and Thomas Pain's, but saw their way to Major Waldron's, where they intended immediately to secure themselves; but coming to the gate and calling and knocking could receive no answer, yet saw a light in one of the chambers and one of them say, looking through a crack in the gate, that he saw sundry Indians within the garrison which supposed had murdered Major Waldron and his family, and thereupon they betook themselves to make an escape, which they did, and met one of Otis's sons who also escaped from his father's garrison informing that his father and the rest of the family were killed. Quickly after they set sundry houses on fire. This is all the account we have at present, and being given in a surprise, may admit of some alterations; but doubtless the most of those at or about Cocheca are destroyed." - From a letter by Richard Waldron Jr, Esq. of Portsmouth, New Hampshire

"The Ham House at Garrison Hill, Dover, New Hampshire was in existence in 1696, and is thought to have been built in 1680. It was not attacked by the Indians on June 28th, 1689 because Mr. Eben Varney who built it was a Quaker, and maintained friendly terms with the Indians." - From a postcard of John Ham's home at Garrison Hill

It appears a new stone was set by 1972 with an unintentional error of her death date as her obituary published March 21, 1889 in the Pittsfield Advertiser notes she died in Hartland on March 10, 1889 at 83yrs old; b.1806 matching all Census reports from 1850 thru 1880.

#### Obituary.

Died in Hartland, March 10, at her son's, Mr. John C Ham, Mrs. Lydia Ham, wife of Dea. Samuel Ham, aged 33 years. She came from New Hampshire to Hartland at the age of 18 years. She faithfully toiled for the support of her family of ten children. She was sick for four weeks. She had a hope in thist and said she was not afraid to die. She leaves four sons and one d aughter to mourn their loss.
