Noah Hubbard

War of 1812

- Noah Hubbard, a Veteran of the War of 1812, came from Sidney to Canaan in the days when the trail from Sidney was nothing but a spotted line through the forest. They settled on Herrin Hill, which was then a part of Hartland. The land is owned at present (1912) by his grandson Ensign F. Hubbard (son of Edward) of Hartland. The first shanty of the pioneer was built near a big boulder on the side of the hill. Later a log house a little more pretentious was erected nearby. Still later Mr. Hubbard, with his son Orren, moved down into the valley near the pond (Morrill Pond), where they built a log house, the traces of which may still be seen, on the farm now owned (1912) by George Henry Hubbard, a grandson of the pioneer (Orren's son). ~ Compiled from 1911-1912 East Somerset County Register*

Vital Records for Fairfax, the future town of Albion, note marriage intentions of a Noah Hubbard to a Deborah Baker but no further details for confirmation. Deborah is thought to have been the widow of Joseph Baker (1772-1808) with a child born to them listed in Hartland Vital Records with the rest of the Hubbard Family as "Cynthia Baker, daughter of Mrs. Hubbard, born July 21, 1800."

In C/1820 & C/1830, they were living at their first homestead in what was then part of Hartland on the old County Road at the base of Herrin Hill, so called, west of Morrill Pond. They moved closer to Morrill Pond by C/1850 where they were living with their son Orren in the former part of Hartland that had been ceded to Canaan in 1849 with Noah noted at 60yrs old and Deborah at 74yrs old. Deborah was still living with Orren and his family in Canaan in C/1860 following Noah's death noted at 84yrs old.

They were living at his father's former homestead on the old County Road at the base of Herrin Hill, so called, in C/1840 in the part of West Hartland which was ceded to Canaan in 1849. They would be noted living in Canaan from C/1850 onward and noted at the same location on the 1860 Somerset County map.

*He enlisted for the war in Vermont with his younger brother Ensign on 8 Feb 1862 noting his residence as Canaan, Maine and was mustered into service on 12 Apr 1862. **Died in Service** from disease at an unspecified location on 15 June 1862 according to his military record. Canaan Vital Records also note he died "in the Army" but list a death date of 15 June 1863. His father later applied for his war death pension on 17 Nov 1881 noting Walter's name & regiment.*

He was born in what was then part of Hartland before it was ceded to Canaan in 1849. He was listed in Canaan in C/1850 & C/1860 with his parents and siblings at the same former West Hartland homestead.

According to his service record from an 1892 Report of the Adjutant General's Office of Vermont, he enlisted in Vermont at the same time as his older brother Walter S. Hubbard on 8 Feb 1862; both noting their residence as Canaan, Maine and both mustered into service 12 Apr 1862 with the 3rd Regiment of Vermont Infantry, Company K. The record only states he was transferred to the Veterans Reserve Corps on 15 Feb 1864 and discharged from service on 14 Nov 1865. He was also listed by name, regiment & residence in a 29 June 1862 Burlington (Vermont) Times newspaper article among the "Sick and Wounded" at an unnamed Marine Hospital but his specific condition was not noted.

Ensign's service record he provided for the 1890 Census Special Veteran Addendum for Canaan varies slightly as he added he was discharged from the 3rd Vermont Infantry in 1863 and "Reenlisted as a Veteran" (no date given) with the 1st Regiment of Veterans Reserve Corps, Company K. His 1885 application for an Invalid War Pension notes his service with both of these Regiments & Companies.

They were living in Canaan in C/1880 after they married near the Slab City Schoolhouse south of Morrill Pond where Ensign was listed as a "Huckster" (Salesman) along with their son Walter noted at 9yrs old and infant daughter Cora. They were still living in Canaan in 1890 just before Ensign purchased the former Martin W. Jenkins Store on Main Street (future Lewis' Market) and began operating it by 1895 as "E. F. Hubbard Groceries, Notions & Hardware". By 1900, he built the first of four houses on an extended driveway next to the store posthumously named after him in 1957 as an official town street as Hubbard Avenue. They moved to Pittsfield Avenue by C/1910 next to Carl Randlett. Ensign sold the store in 1920 shortly after Augusta's death.

She remained on Commercial Street in Hartland after Walter's death noted as Head of

Household in C/1940 with Lloyd, Ardis and Lloyd Jr living with her. In C/1950, she was living on Elm Street with Lloyd and his family noted as his widowed mother at 64yrs old.
