He came from Vermont to Greene as a young man possibly joining his older brother John Stafford who was noted living there in the 1800 Census. Anna's family lived in neighboring Wales and following their marriage, she and Solomon were living in Greene in C/1810 before moving north with their family to North Hill by C/1820. They moved to North Hartland sometime in the mid-1820s living there in C/1830 where they settled on the Athens Road at the corner of the Old Ferry Road near what would become known as Stafford Pond. They remained in North Hartland noted there with some of their children in C/1840 & C/1850. Following Solomon's death, Anna was listed in C/1860 in the household of their son John N. Stafford in North Hartland at 68yrs old.

"North Hill was settled in 1801 and incorporated as a town on June 20, 1816 from the township T2-R1 BKP (Bingham's Kennebec Purchase aka 'Million Acres Range'). It changed its name to Brighton on January 29, 1827. The town ceded land to Athens in 1838 and again in 1862. In 1895 Brighton surrendered its organization as a town and reemerged as Brighton Plantation." ~ Maine Encyclopedia

"Solomon Stafford came to Hartland from Brighton about 80 years ago, and settled near Stafford pond which took its name from him. His children were Nelson, Jacob, Orin, Joel, Harrison, Johnson, Elias, Leonard, Richard, Albion, Martha m. Towle." (Missing are Elizabeth & John) ~ 1911-1912 East Somerset County Register

An early Hartland Vital Record entry notes a partial record of the family at the time with some of the older children's names and birth dates but no birth locations. Their children's birth locations are based on circumstantial evidence including Census locations noted above and their son Orin's death certificate listing his place of birth as Brighton (North Hill) in 1813. Their son Nelson's <u>presumed</u> death in Hartland in 1826 circumstantially implies they were living there by that date. (See bottom for original)

Following Elizabeth's death, John married for a 3rd time to Hannah Barnes. They were living in Harmony in C/1850 with he & Sally's son Obed Dore and 3 of he & Elizabeth's 4 children Mary, Maria & John along with he & Hannah's oldest child Edwin L. Dore who was born about 1848.

The 1850 Census was taken on July 24th in Harmony and they moved soon after to Princeton, Wisconsin where their 2nd son Alfred Dore was noted to be born on October 29, 1850. John & Hannah built their homestead in Princeton and remained there until his death in 1863. A 3rd son Ruel A. Dore was born in Princeton in 1853. It remains unclear how many of the Dore children came to Wisconsin with them as an 1860 Census for the family has not yet been found.

Following John's death in 1863, Hannah moved to Grant, Wisconsin near Neillsville and lived with her step-son John S. Dore until he left for California in 1883. She then moved to Lake Benton, Minnesota living with her son Ruel A. Dore until her death in 1888.

In 1854, he moved from his father's homestead in Princeton to Wedge's Creek, Wisconsin working as a logger at about 16 years old before moving to Neillsville, Wisconsin.

"He began teaching school at the first schoolhouse in Neillsville at the age of 18 years and afterwards studied one year at Galesville University. In 1861 he and a partner established the Union & Flag Journal in Neillsville which he published for several years before opening the Clark County Journal in 1867. He took an active part in local politics, was Chairman of the County Board, and County Superintendent of Schools for the term of

ten years. He was also a member of the State Board of Agriculture for three years. After selling his paper he purchased a 400 acre lot on Pleasant Ridge in Grant, Wisconsin where he built his house and farm; later known as the Youmans Farm.

He also went into the lumber business, but that proved a failure, and broken in health and finances he moved to Fresno, California in 1883. There he purchased land in the Bank of Central California tract which is now known as West Park. He steadily improved this tract and at the time of his death owned one of the most fertile vineyards in this section of the state becoming one of the leading vineyardists of central California.

He was a diligent laborer for the upbuilding of the viti-cultural and horticultural interests of the community and was one of the first shippers of green fruit out of Fresno County. He joined the Farmers' Alliance in 1890 and attended the first state meeting in San Jose in November of the same year. He was chosen Chairman of the Executive Committee and always took an active part in the work of the Alliance and in public life."

It is unclear if Isaac moved to Wisconsin with his father but he had moved to California in late 1859 where his older half-brother Benjamin Dore was living. He was working in the gold mines when he was killed in an accidental premature explosion.

Along with birth, death and marriage details, numerous first hand stories are told including the gruesome murder of his Aunt Sarah (Stafford) Lamb. They were living with their son Albert and his family in Hamilton in C/1860 along with their youngest children James & Almeda. After Jacob's death, Roxanna was living with her daughter Almeda Coleman in Hamilton in C/1870 until Almeda's death in 1871 when she moved to David City, Nebraska living with her son Albert in C/1880 until her death.

Mr. Stafford, who was a very earnest worker for the cause of temperance and women's suffrage, was addressing a meeting of the W.C.T.U. at the Home Chapel last evening, when he stepped backward, fell and was dead. Mr. Stafford was born in Maine on August 30, 1840, being 77 years, eight months and seven days old at the time of his demise. He leaves to mourn his loss three sons and three daughters, his wife (Tabitha) having preceded him in death three years ago. The remains were shipped to David City at 11:05 a.m. accompanied by relatives, where interment will be made." - Grand Island (Nebraska) Daily - Thursday May 24, 1917

He enlisted for 3 years on August 29, 1861 in Hartland noted as 20yrs old, single and a Teamster. Mustered into service September 22, 1861 serving as a Wagoneer for the regiment until he was mustered out at the end of his term on September 27, 1864. They were living in Portland in C/1870 and moved to Boston by 1872 where he worked as a Brakeman for the railroad. She remarried to William F. Booker in 1880 in Boston. Charles was admitted to Togus Veterans Home on 2 occasions for long term war related illnesses. He was last released in November of 1906 and returned to his home in Boston.

Eugene and Camille were well known hot air balloon exhibitionists and traveled the country giving performances. He was involved in a controversial shooting death of a former employee in 1904 with his wife present but was never convicted because Camille refused to testify against him. Controversy followed him when the circumstances of Camille's death from blood poisoning were noted as suspicious by local authorities and her estranged husband was brought in for questioning however no arrest was ever made. His death was ruled a suicide by carbolic acid poisoning.

They resided in Quebec, Vermont and Missouri after they married and were living in New Hampshire by C/1880 where he was listed in the 1890 Census Veteran Addendum noting his service with the 9th Maine. They were in Franklin, New Hampshire in C/1900 with several of their 9 children before moving to Ashburnham, Massachusetts by C/1910.
