Elizabeth Emerson d/o Thomas Emerson b. 14 June 1623 Bishop, Stortford County, England d. 1689 Ipswich, Massachusetts John arrived in Massachusetts from England at about 15 years old with his older brother William Fuller, Jr who was about 25 years old aboard the 'Abigail' as noted on the ship's passenger list. The 'Abigail' left Plymouth, England on June 4, 1635 with about 220 passengers along with livestock. During the voyage, an outbreak of smallpox had occurred when she arrived in Boston on October 8, 1635.

John settled in Ipswich, Massachusetts and married Elizabeth Emerson, daughter of Thomas Emerson who had settled in Ipswich in 1638. John moved to Salisbury, Massachusetts about 1639 but returned to Ipswich by 1643 where he was later Town Surveyor in 1663, Town Commissioner in 1664 and owned land near Rocky Hill. Elizabeth married 2nd to Thomas Perrin.

James was the original settler of West Hartland arriving in 1802 around the age of 16 where he settled at what became Fullers Corner on the County Road where he built his house and farmed the land. Rebeccah came with her parents to Maine in the early 1800s and grew up in Palmyra.

James later built a stagecoach stop known as Fuller's Tavern for passengers on the Norridgewock to Bangor Stage Coach Route running through West Hartland past Fullers Corner. The County Road stage coach route continued past Fullers Corner and crossed the Hartland-Pittsfield Road at Davis Corner then crossing the Sebasticook River Bridge into Palmyra on its way to Palmyra Village then onto Newport, Stetson and Bangor.

James and his father signed the 1819 petition to incorporate Hartland as a town. He was very active in early town affairs serving as Town Selectman, Probate and Postmaster. Fuller's Tavern was used as one of several locations of early Town Meetings in West Hartland. The site of the old tavern was later the location of Foster Brooks' home.

In 1852, Warren successfully petitioned the Legislature to have his 15 acre property in West Hartland near Fullers Corner annexed to Pittsfield. Fuller had been an active member in town affairs having served as Town Constable and was a House Representative at the time. Local legend holds there was a dispute between Fuller and town officials concerning management of certain town affairs. An attempt by Pittsfield in 1969 to gift the lot back was rejected by Hartland voters and it would be 1997 before a Legislative Act returned the contentious lot to again be part of Hartland after 145 years.

Laura is a sister of Esther who married his brother John Warren Fuller.

Mrs. Laura, wife of Thomas Fuller, died April 17, at the advanced age or S8 years. Mrs. Fuller had been in failing health for some time, but was only confined to her bed for a few weeks prior to her death. She was born in St. Albans and lived there until her marriage to and lived there until her marriage to Mr. Fuller, 58 years ago, when they came to Hartland, and purchased the farm, where they resided all the years of their married life. Some ten years ago, their daughter Lizzie who lived with them, was taken by death from the the aged parents, and shortly after that the only remaining child, Mrs. Harry Randlett, moved home to care for them, and faithfully has she fulfilled her trust and faithfully has she fulfilled her trust. The aged father is now confined to his bed, and has been totally blind for several years. Mrs. Fuller in her younger days, united with the Baptist church, but later in life she changed her religous views becoming a Spiritualist, in which faith she died. Her maiden name was Butterfield, and she was one of eight children, only one of whom survive, and he was very ill at the time of his sister's death. The funeral was held at the home April 19, Rev. L. W. Coons of Pittsfield, conducting the ser-vices. The floral offerings were profuse and beautiful. Interment in Fullef Corner Cemetary.

Thomas Fuller, aged 87 years, died at his home in West Hartland May 20, after several years of failing health and surviving his aged wife only five weeks. During his last years he has been cared for by his only living child, Mrs. Ellen Randlett. Funeral services were held from the house Sunday, Rev. L. W. Coons of Pittsfield officiating, assisted by Rev. Miss Angell. The interment was-in the family lot at Fuller's Corner cemetery. Mr. Fuller was prominent in town affairs until old age and failing health detained him more at his home. He served the town several years as one of its selectmen and was until recently one of the board of trustees of Hartland Academy. In politics he was a staunch Democrat and a well-read politician. Mr. Fuller's father was Hartland's first settler and it was on the place that Thomas Fuller died that Mr. Fuller, Sr., settled. Beside the daughter, Mrs. Randlett, two sisters, Mrs. Burrill of Skowhegan and Mrs. Larabee of this town, and one brother, E. K. Fuller, also of Hartland, survive him.

She never married.
After graduating from Hartland Academy, Jennie attended the Salem Normal School in Salem, Massachusetts when she was 17 years old. The school, which would become Salem State College, was an all woman's school for the "Preparation of Female Teachers" as noted in its 1871 brochure of which she is noted as a student under her given name Sarah J. Fuller.

She then attended Boston University School of Medicine where she received her degree as a Doctor of Medicine in 1882. After practicing medicine in St Paul, Minnesota for the next several years, she returned to Hartland in 1888 to carry on her professional career practicing homeopathic medicine for the next 20+ years until she retired in 1920.

She was very well known as a fierce advocate for woman's rights and is mentioned in this 1916 article; "Suffrage work in Maine was carried on for many years in the face of the greatest obstacles but there was always a small group of devoted women willing to make any sacrifice for the cause, who carried the torch until another group could take it, and every step gained was fought for. The history would be incomplete without mention of the Portland Equal Franchise League. The list of State officers who freely gave their services is too long to publish. Among other prominent workers not already mentioned are Dr. Jennie Fuller of Hartland."

According to reports of the day, Dr. Jennie was never reluctant to express her opinion on all matters. She never married and listed her marital status on every Census as single. She lived at her father's house on Elm Street, the future Baptist Church Parsonage, during most of her adult life while in Hartland, sharing her home for many years with her younger sister Harriet (Fuller) Baker who was widowed in 1902.

Henry became President of the restructured Linn Manufacturing Company formed after
the death of his father-in-law Archibald Linn in 1889. He was co-founder of the FullerOsborne Company and had several other business interests including the Newport
Woolen Mill and also served on the Board of Directors of Pittsfield National Bank.
Following his death, Mary had "Fuller Mansion" built across the street from their
former home on Elm Street with its construction beginning in the spring of 1904.

Henry C. Fuller, president of the Linn Woolen Co., Hartland, Mc., diel in the Boaton city hospital. March II. His health had not been robust for some time, and his condition was such that about three weeks ago, accompanied by Mrs. Fuller, he came to Boston for treatment. Mr. Fuller was been in Hartland, about C years ago. He was a son of the late James Fuller, who was a prominent citi-zen of Hartland in the earlier history of the town. Henry received his education in the public schools at Hartiand, and at the Hartiand neademy, finishing his school encers at Westbrook. Then he went into business with his father, who cas conducting a large general store in Hartland.

In the year 1875, or thereabouts, Mr. Fuller married Miss Mary I. Linu, closet daughter of Hon. Archibald Linu, the pro-prietor of the woolen mill at Hardland. Soon after this, Mr. Fuller was taken in-to the Linn office in a confidential capac-ity, and as he became expert in woolen manufacturing, relieved Mr. Linn of the caree of the management in many ways. After Mr. Linn died, 11 or 12 years ago, a corporation, the Linn Woolen Co., was formed to continue the business, with Mr. Fuller as president and general manager, and in these capacities he ably served the corporation for the remainder of his life. Under Mr. Fuller's management the business has grown and prospered, until the plant is now about three times as large as it was at the time of Mr. Linn's death.

and is regarded as one of the most successful woolen mills in Maine.

Several years ago Mr. Fuller, with Gor-don Dobson and J. W. Manson, of Pittsfield, baught the woolen mill at Newport, which has been successfully operated by them since that time. Of this corporation. Mr. Fuller was the treasurer and wool buyer. Mr. Fuller owned considerable real estate in and about Hartland, and his great energy and keen business foresight had surrounded him and his family with very many of the comforts and lusurles of life.

Six children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Fuller, three of whom survive their fa-ther-James E., Guy and Elmer, Mr. Fuller was a charter member of Hartland at his home in Hartland, Saturday, March lodge No. 101, I. O. O. F., but so far as 14, 1800, at one o'clock p. m.
